The font for practice



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Preparation - Before we start

1/ Choose a suitable pen for practicing

Any kind of art has its own specific materials. For example, when you learn to play guitar: better guitar, easier to practice & more beautiful melodies. If you choose to practice with a very low quality guitar, sometimes it is likely impossible to achieve anything.

The same for handwriting practice. It is surely that after mastering the art of beautiful handwriting, you may write beautifully with varied types of pen. However, before being an expert in beautiful handwriting, you should choose a fountain pen that is designed for beautiful writing practice. That fountain pen should be:

- Able for writing thick and thin strokes easily - this one is the most important requirement. Therefore, please check carefully before buying as not any fountain pen is for writing thick and thin letters.
- Suitable for writing at the font size in a practice sheet that you are planning to use for practice.
- Suitable size for your hand so your hand will not be hurt or tired when writing.

Depending on the fountain pens you choose, you may need some research about how to maintain the quality of your pens to avoid ink-stuck issues or broken-nib problems.

2/ Paper:

Graph paper with 2.0-2.5mm thin grid lines is useful for effective handwriting practice. This can help you practice consistent letter height and spacing. Grid paper is especially useful if you're working on specific handwriting styles or calligraphy.

You may also consider the paper's weight, smoothness, quality and decoration for your best experiences.

3/ Know how to hold a pen



Standard way to hold a pen is using three fingers (middle finger, index finger and thumb) of your right hand to hold your pen. The distance between your index finger to the top of the pen nib is around 1 inch. If you find that it is quite uncomfortable with the standard way, be patient as well

as check if your pen size is suitable with your hand or not. You may want to try a larger or smaller pen to know about it.

4/ Sitting posture and brightness

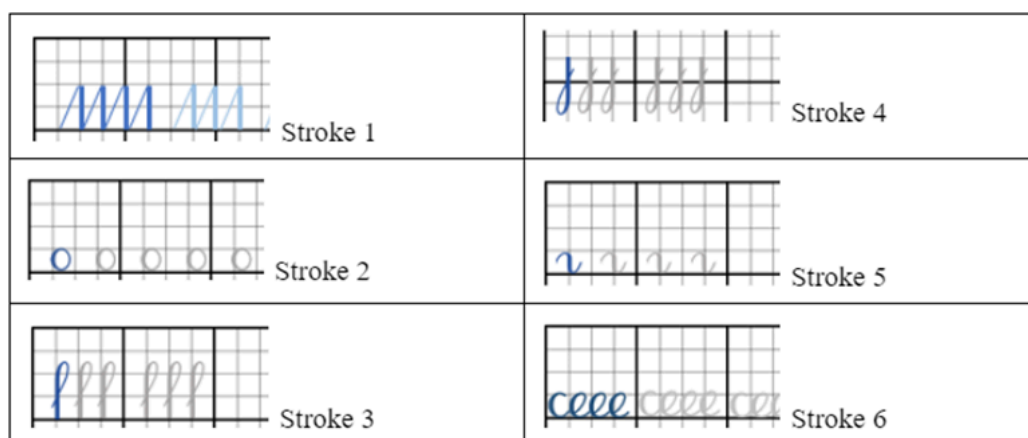


Sitting posture and brightness is also another thing you should consider as they may lead to negative effects on your eyes and your back. It also makes you feel uncomfortable and lose your focus when practicing.

MASTER THE BASIC (6 STEPS)

6 basic strokes for practice

Do you notice that 26 letters in the English alphabet share some similar strokes? Mastering the 6 basic strokes are an essential step for your successful handwriting practice journal.



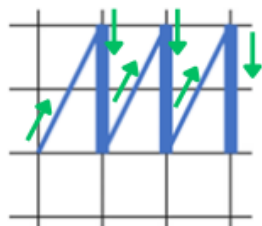
Follow the rule: downstrokes are thick, upstrokes are thin

The rule is a basic concept that you need to apply in every part of your handwriting practice

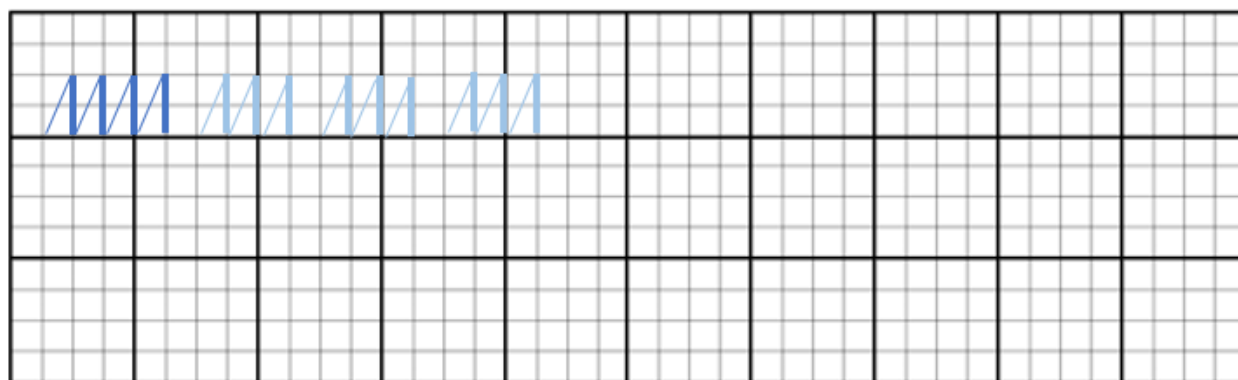


- ❖ Downstrokes are thick

Step 1: Practice with stroke 1



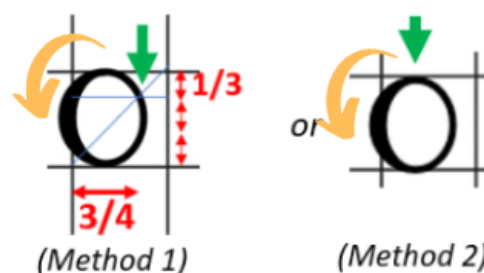
In this step, we will practice writing the zig-zag stroke which will help you to be familiar with the rule “Thin up - Thick down”.



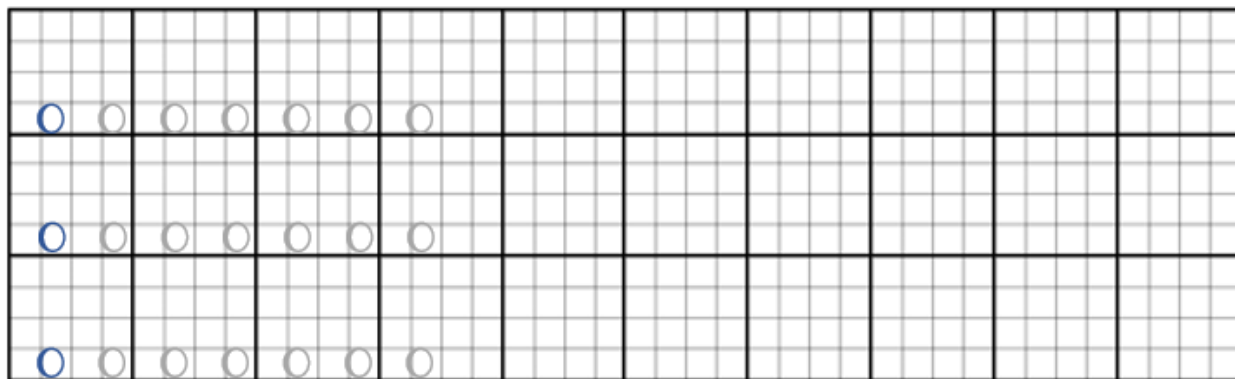
Step 2: Practice with stroke 2

The green arrows indicate where we start writing a letter “o”.

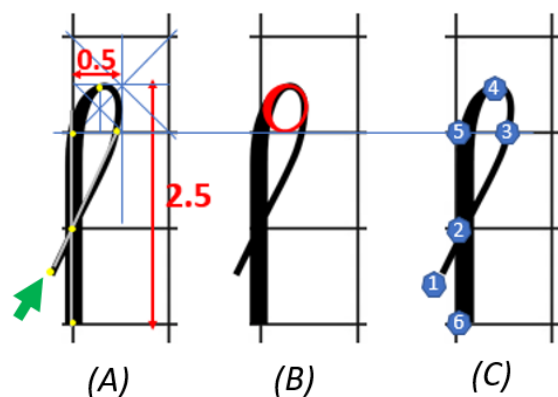
While the second method is more popular, the first method is essential to practice cursive handwriting. You should learn both styles but start with the first method.



Tip & Trick: When writing “o” with the first method, you can imagine the letter inside the square that you are going to write. It means that you have just written a letter “o” with your mind on the paper; then make it become real with your hand.



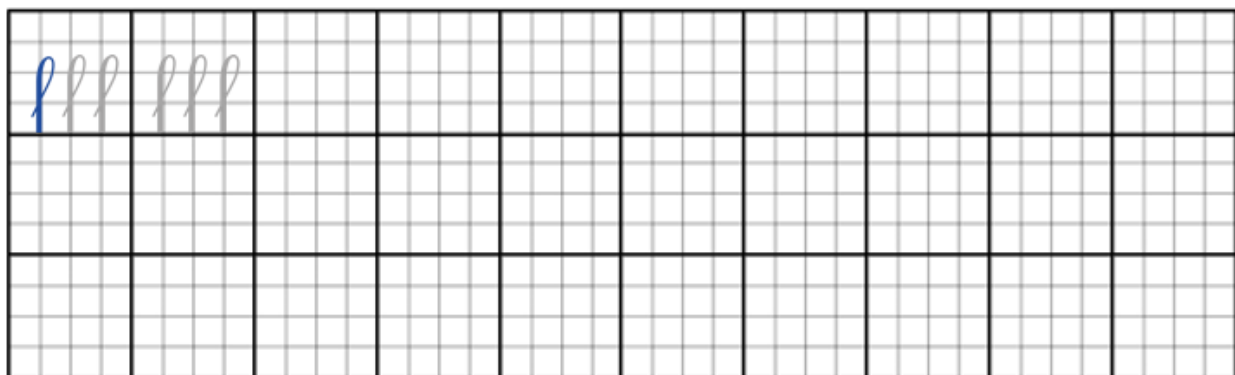
Step 3: Practice with stroke 3



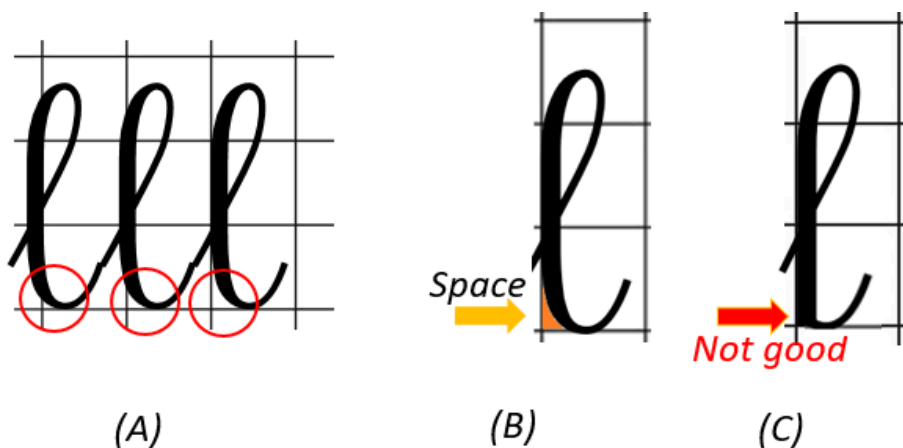
(A): Size of the stroke

(B): The top of the *l* stroke looks like the letter “o”

(C): To write the stroke: Make a straight line from ① to ③, then make a round shape from ③ to ⑤. Finally make a straight line to ⑥



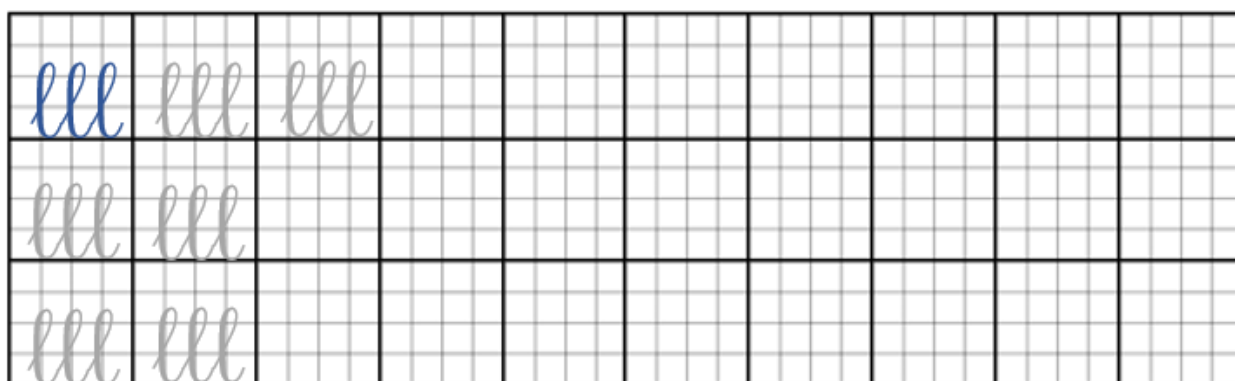
When practicing with stroke 3, it is a good idea to practice writing letter *l* at the same time.



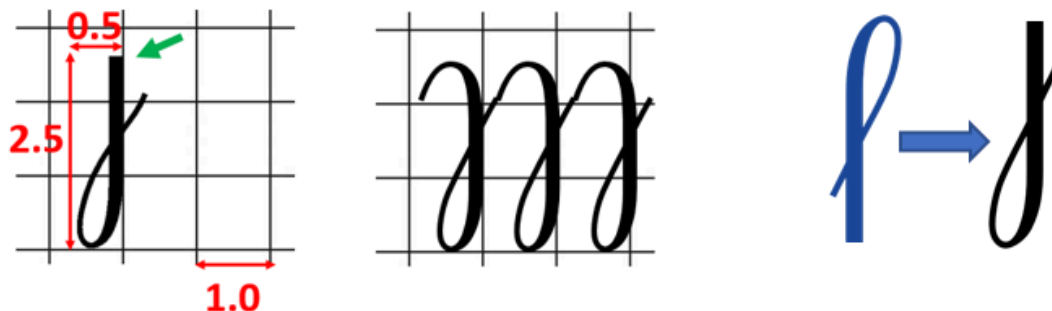
(A) *Make a cursive shape when writing a letter *l**

(B) *When you write the letter *l* with a right technique, there will be a space like in the image.*

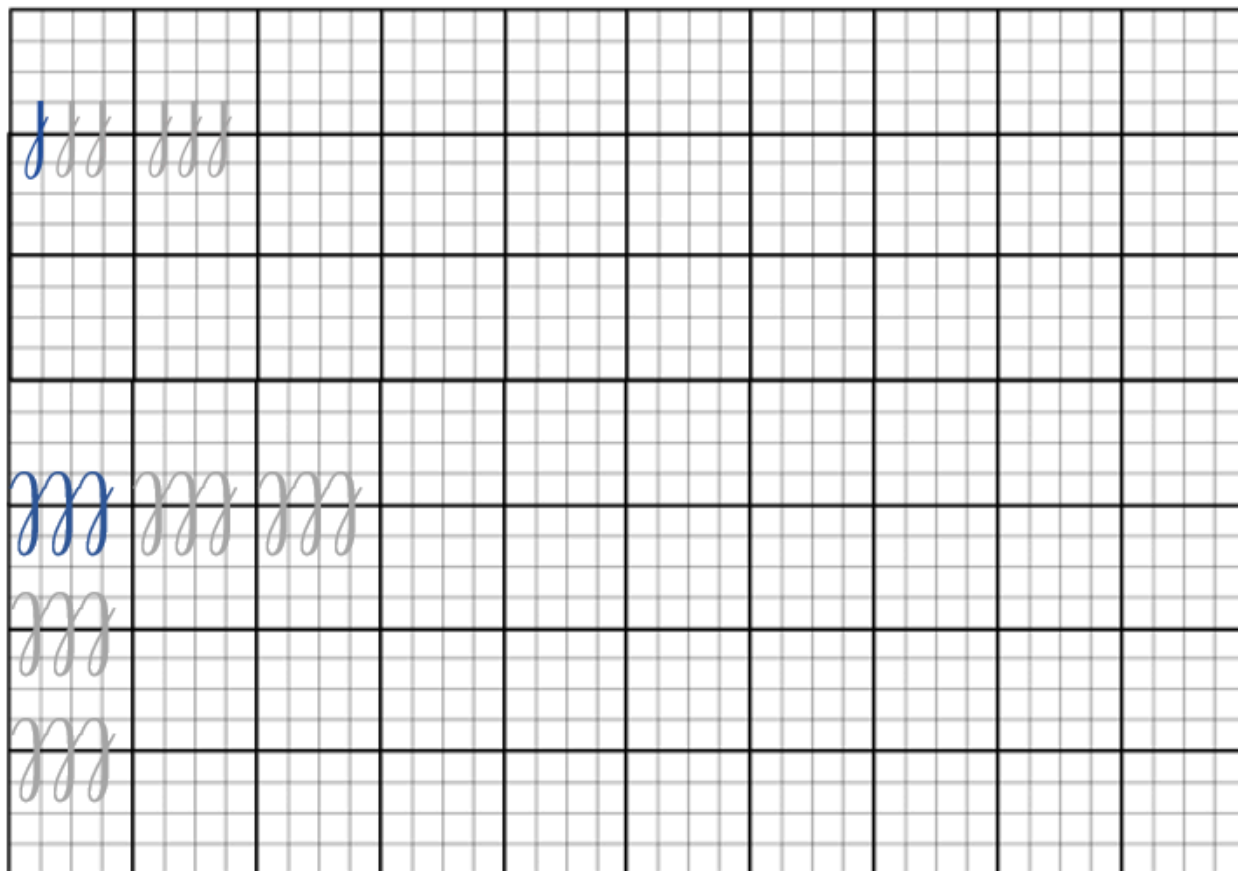
(C) *Wrong technique will lead to no space*



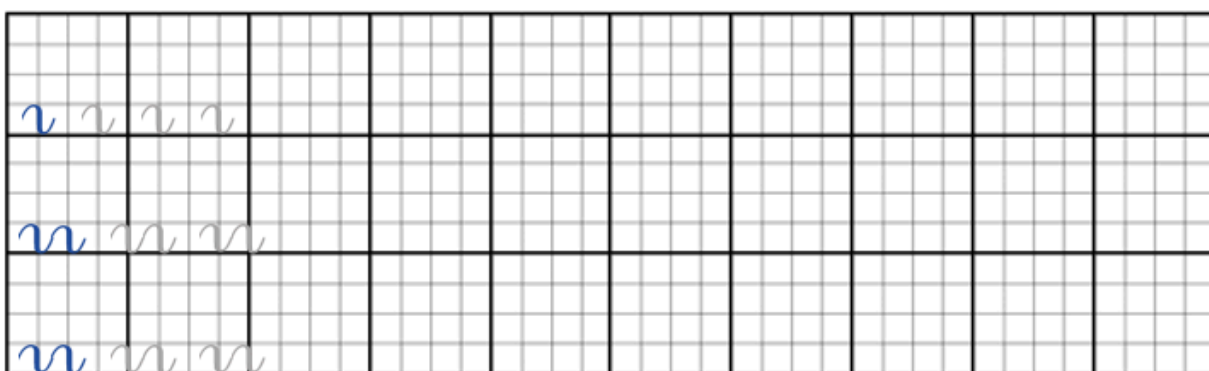
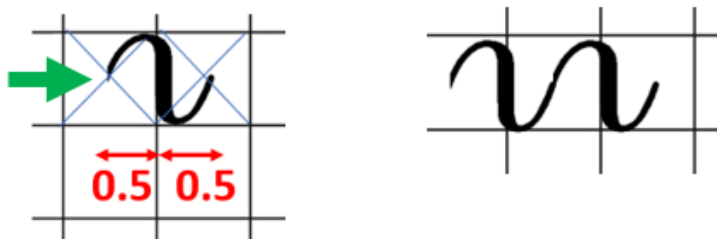

Step 7: Writing letters having stroke 2



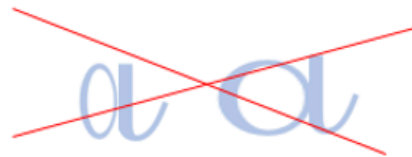
When writing a letter, try to write it with 1 single stroke only.



Writing a letter as combination of 2 separated strokes is not recommended

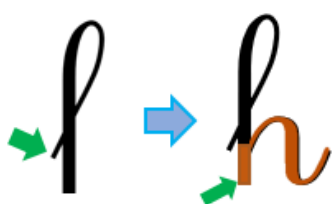
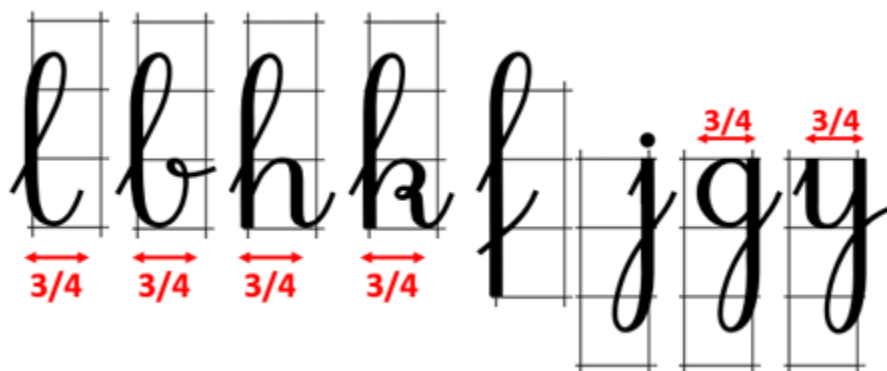


A beautiful letter has 2 spaces between "o" stroke and "l" stroke



Wrong side of "o" shape is a popular mistake when practicing

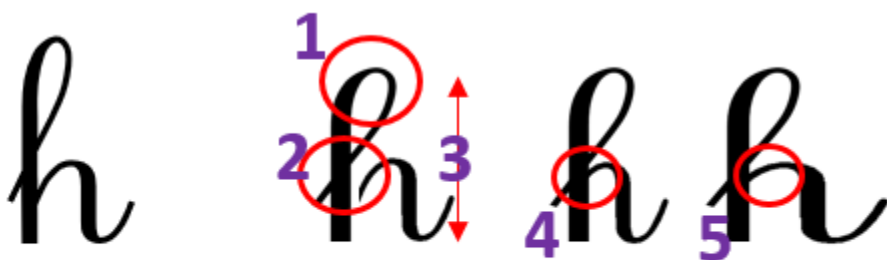
Step 8: Writing letters having stroke 3 and 4

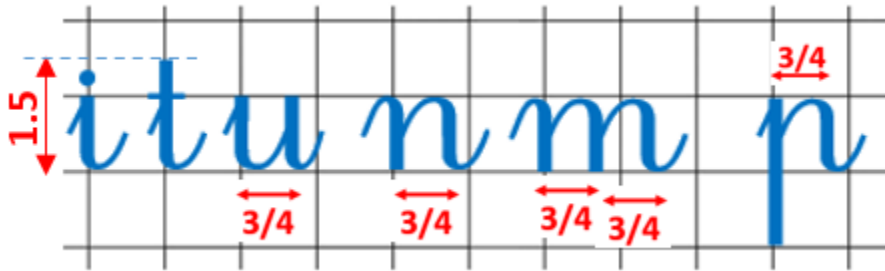

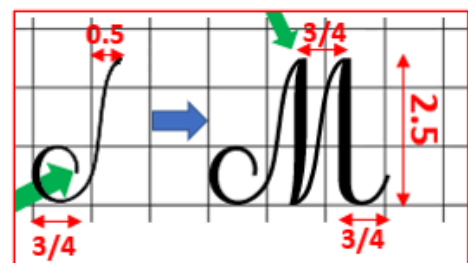
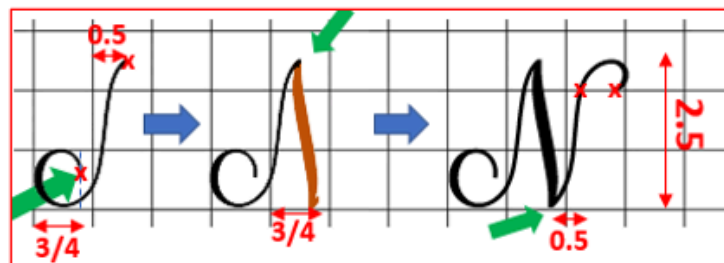
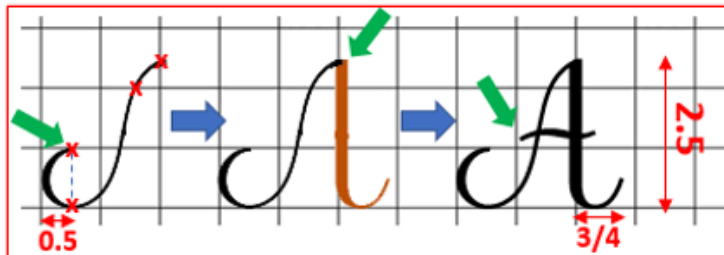
Step 10: Practice with the rest
